Events report of the year 2021-2022

In the following section, we will discuss and describe the events that EFR organized during the 2021-2022 academic year

Bachelor guides

Each year, EFR offers students guides to the various bachelor years in economics. These guides not only provide study advice, but they also inform students about the choices they will need to make in later years. This project is done in collaboration with the ESE.

Book sale

EFR collaborates with Studystore to offer discounts to EFR members on their study books during the Book Sale.

City Trips

EFR organizes two city trips each year: one for Dutch students and one for IBEB students. The IBEB city trip went to Paris, and the Dutch city trip went to Budapest. These trips provided students with cultural, educational, and social experiences.

Committee members weekend

The Committee Members Weekend in Loon op Zand (the Netherlands) functioned as a team-building event. Through games, drinks, and parties, EFR created a positive working atmosphere among the students.

Drinks

EFR organized a drink for all its members every study block (five times in total). These drinks aimed to promote socializing and networking among members, increase coherency between committee members, and enhance EFR's positive reputation in the field of leisure and entertainment.

EFR Master Career Week

In its third year, the Master Career Week offered students five different bootcamps, despite the challenges posed by COVID-19 restrictions. The event was a great success, with many participating companies and students.

Erasmus Recruitment Days

Organized in collaboration with the RSM study association STAR, the Erasmus Recruitment Days is the largest on-campus recruitment event in Europe. This year, more than 1500 students participated in workshops, training, interviews, and company dinners.

ESE/EFR Job market skills

The ESE/EFR Job market skills training week aims to prepare students for the labor market by developing both hard and soft skills. Through a variety of training sessions provided by partners of EFR, students receive one ECTS for their participation.

iBuddy Programme

In coordination with ESE, the iBuddy programme pairs international students who have lived in Rotterdam for more than a year with new students at the beginning of the year. These "buddies" help out with starting problems each international student has in the beginning of the year, with a focus on exploring neighboring cities and local cultures.

Inspiration Days

This year the first physical edition of the EFR Inspiration Days took place on campus. This congress aims at inspiring attendees with amongst others workshops, a lunch round table and a panel discussion.

Introduction days

For both IBEB and the Dutch Economics bachelor programme, an introduction day is organized, in order to help new students with getting to know fellow students and getting settled in their new student life.

Involve Consultancy Project

This year, the Involve Consultancy Project collaborated with UNHCR. The project entailed desk research and field research in Uganda.

Master Orientation Days

The Master Orientation Days aim to stimulate students to think about their study choices in the later years of their studies. Three Master Orientation Days were organized this year, including a Port Day, Government Day, and Finance Day.

Model United Nations

EFR hosted its second edition of Model United Nations, called EFR MUNROT.

Ski Trip

The ski trip, available for all EFR members, went to Risoul with a group of 90 participants.

Study Trip

This years study trip went to Portugal (Lisbon and Porto). The trip provided students with cultural, educational, and social experiences.

Women in Business

The first edition of Women in Business was a great success, inspiring female students to pursue their ambitions and achieve their goals. This event provided a platform for female students to network, learn from industry experts, and share their experiences, empowering them to succeed in the business world.

Other events

In addition to these flagship events, EFR also organised a range of smaller events for its members, including a beer cantus and a boat party. These events offered members the chance to relax, socialise, and have fun outside of their academic pursuits.
